Angels of Charity Award.

The Angels of Charity Award is specifically designed to recognise those individual, groups and organisations who provide or carry out significant charitable deeds for the benefit of others.

The award is not constrained by the age of the individual and could be awarded to young people as well as adults in and out of the Order of St George.

Finding and rewarding them is very difficult, as most of them are not seeking recognition and ask for nothing, but are quietly working away carrying out their good deeds. These are the true 'angels of charity'.

Therefore, the Order will, as far as possible, using the resources available to it, seek those who really should be recognised and rewarded and ensure it does its best to do so.

It will do this through regularly reminding its members, publically and privately, to seek out and inform it of these 'angels of charity' and ensure that nominations are made.

The Angels of Charity Award will come in two distinct forms and be awarded at the discretion of the United Kingdom Grand Prior, after consultation with the Grand Council to decide on the level of the award to be given. There are no post-nominals associated with the award.

Award 1 - Award of Merit - A4 framed and signed Angel(s) of Charity certificate impressed with the Order's crest and seal setting out the reason for the award – what the individual group or organisation has done, signed by the Patron (if there is one), the United Kingdom Grand Prior and the United Kingdom Grand Chancellor. Within the frame will be a representation of the Angel of Charity medal.

The award will be presented by the Grand Prior at a formal ceremony. In the Grand Prior's absence, the responsibility will be delegated to another Senior Officer of Grand Cross Rank.

Award 2 – Award of Distinction - Significant or Outstanding Charitable work - A4 framed and signed Angel(s) of Charity certificate impressed with the Order's crest and seal setting out the reason for the award – what the individual or group has done, signed by the Patron (if there is one), the United Kingdom Grand Prior and the United Kingdom Grand Chancellor. Within the frame will be a representation of the Angel of Charity medal.

A full-sized bronze coloured medal with a longitudinal, ½ Blue and ½ red ribbon (the main colours of the Order). Each individual within a group would receive a medal.

The awards will be presented by the Grand Prior at a formal ceremony. In the Grand Prior's absence, the responsibility may be delegated to another Senior Officer of Grand Cross Rank.

The Angels of Charity medal will be a round full-sized bronze coloured medal (no miniature) with the design as for the Order's Medal of Merit but it will not have two colours – just overall bronze. On the reverse will be an angel.

The granting of the Standard or Significant/Outstanding Award will be decided by the United Kingdom Grand Prior in consultation with the Grand Council.

International (non UK and non-America) awards will be agreed between the Maigisterium Officium and the United Kingdom Grand Prior in consultation with the Grand Council.

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
